"The whole congressional delegation wants to try to help us get reimbursement from the federal government. I've said, 'Keep your receipts everybody in North Dakota because we're going to get someone else to pay for this,' and we're going to work hard to make that happen. The last resort is we sue the federal government, but I'm hoping that they'll understand that we've been doing their job for them the last six months, and we've done it well and we've done it probably less expensively than the federal government could have done it."

"We've run... maybe now over 700 people through the arrest process in Morton County, clogging our jails, taking up space, time, and costing the legal system dollars, and then what do we find? They've got these Go Fund Me accounts, people are bailed out minutes after they're entered and then they're right back in the camp again. And so if we're trying to save money and solve the problem, it's better to just get people on a bus and get them out of here than it is to try to pursue things through the legal process. And then part of it was also health and welfare checks... There were people in there that weren't a threat to anyone, and we North Dakotans take care of people and want to do it in the most cost-effective way possible."
